






Five key elements of a future vision for a strong and vibrant Regional Seas Programme supporting GPA implementation (In response to RIO+20)

- 5. Support countries in engaging with international mechanisms












1. 2013-2016 Regional Seas strategic directions

- Effectively apply Ecosystem Based Management
- GPA: Protection from Land Based Activities
- Strengthen capacity for coastal and marine governance
- Promote resource efficiency and productivity
- Strengthen coordination and capacity for state of marine environment reporting
- Strengthen mechanisms for MEA, UN and IFI collaboration











2. Strong partnerships are essential for Regional Seas to deliver effective outcomes



- Global, regional, national, sub-national
- Agencies, civil society, private sector
- Developed long term collaborations as well as strategic, directed partnerships







3. Effective inter-region collaboration

- Twinning between RSCAPs and experience sharing increase delivery of outputs
- Potential for joint support to parties of international MEAs
- Collaboration and support in relation to data synthesis and support (eg EBSA)
- Strategic support to global efforts (eg World Oceans Assessment)












4. Delivery of key strategic efforts across Regional Seas

- Previously strategic efforts including marine assessments, marine litter reports and global synthesis of biodiversity were flagship outputs
- Future potential strategic efforts include:
- Regional Oceans Governance (eg: linking Regional Seas, Large Marine Ecosystems and Regional Fisheries Bodies)
- Effective MPAs including in Areas Beyond National Jurisdiction
- Developing common assessment framework for condition of Regional Seas – to support World Oceans Assessment and national reporting needs (RSCAPs 5 of 6 regional workshops)
- Green Economy in a Blue World (Caribbean April 2013 and W Indian Ocean Nov 2013)












5. Support countries in engaging with international mechanisms

- Linkages, technical support and capacity building on global or emerging issues:
- Deep Sea Minerals
- Oil and Gas Protocols
- Delivery of integrated data on migratory species
- Plastics and marine litter












In Summary:

- Strong synergies and linkages exist with GPA, high potential for support and coordination




