
What is UNEP/MAP – Barcelona Convention?

- Goal: protect Mediterranean marine and coastal environment and promote SD
- Catalyzer of regional and national action through:
 - Periodic assessments of status and threats
 - Strategies/Programmes/Measures
 - Integrated Monitoring
- Activity Centres to support implementation






UNEP-MAP Barcelona Convention Advanced environmental legal framework




Timeline of Barcelona Convention and its Protocols





RAP- Assessment & Monitoring


Part of Integrated Regional Monitoring Programme BC Ecosystem Approach – Assess status every 6 years

❖ Targets:

- Decreased # items in coast
- Decreased # items in water surface & seafloor
- Decreased # items in the stomach content of sentinel species

❖ Goal: Regional Data Bank by 2016
