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Guidance Note for the Working Group for RSSD (2017-2020) on Day 3

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Guidance note

- The Visioning Workshop held in Geneva, Switzerland, 3-4 July 2014 identified the four main themes for the Regional Seas Convention and Action Plans in the coming future: (1) governance;
 (2) pollution; (3) extraction (living and non-living resources); and (4) impacts of climate change and ocean acidification.
- 2. It is proposed that the Regional Seas Strategic Directions (2017-2020) be based on the four main themes.
- 3. According to the four themes, therefore, four (4) working groups will be formed in order to formulate the Regional Seas Strategic Directions (2017-2020)
- The chair of each working group will be designated from the chairs of sessions at the 17th Global Meeting of Regional Seas Conventions and Secretariats that are relevant to each working group. It is proposed that following people will be the chair of each working group:

- 7. Based on the draft prepared by the contact group, working groups will be formulated to finalise the draft Regional Seas Strategic Directions (2017-2020) during the Session 6.
