Enhanced Integrated Solid Waste management measures

By 2020:

- Close illegal land dumpsites
- Prevent ML from dredging activities
- Ensure Adequate urban sewer and WWTP
- Take enforcement measures to combat
 - littering on the beach
 - illegal sewage disposal in the sea, coastal zone and rivers.

By 2025:
