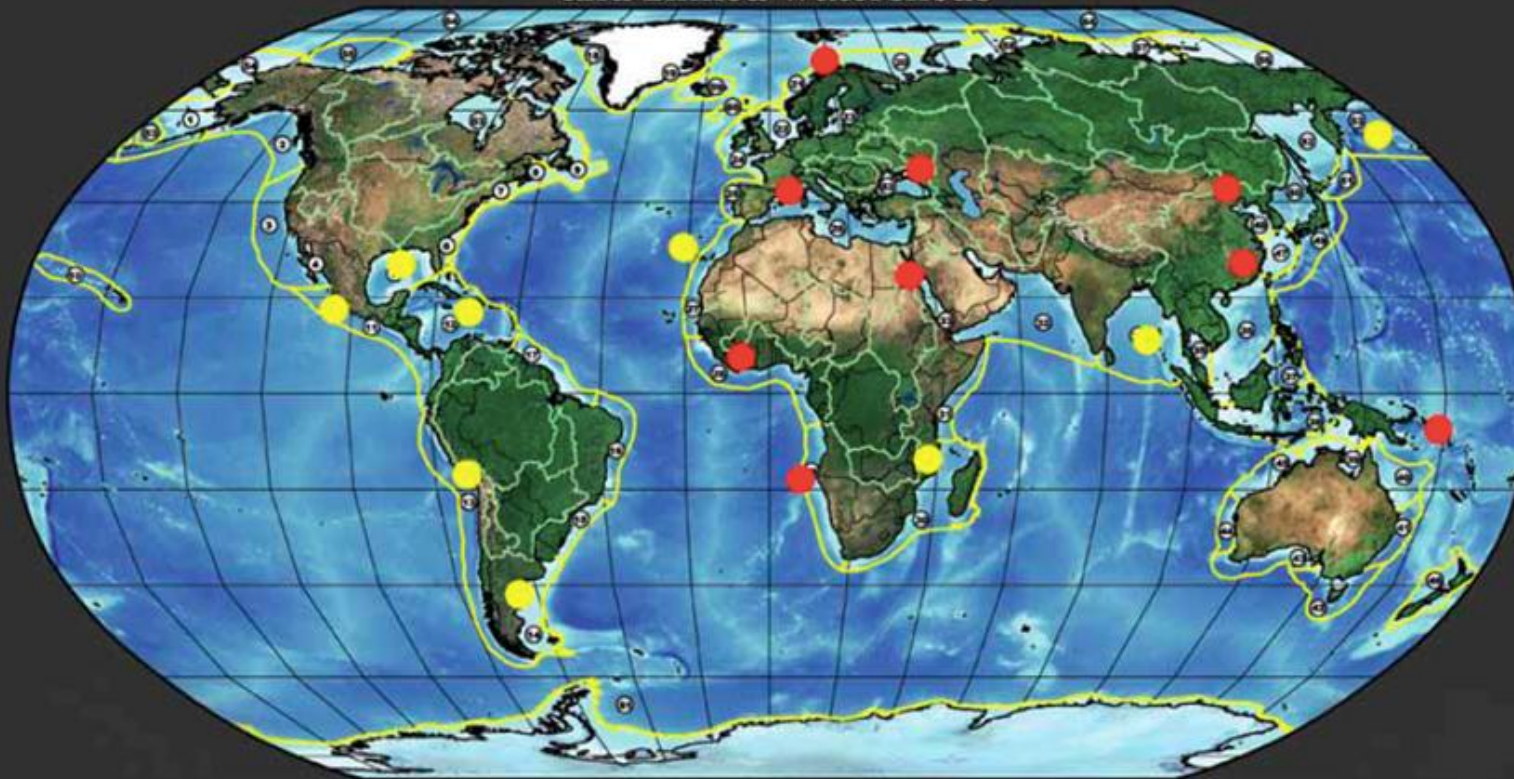

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## Large Marine Ecosystems of the World and Linked Watersheds



*LARGE MARINE ECOSYSTEMS* are areas of the ocean characterized by distinct bathymetry, hydrography, productivity, and trophic interactions. They annually produce 95 percent of the world's fish catch. They are national and regional focal areas of a global effort to reduce the degradation of linked watersheds, marine resources, and coastal environments from pollution, habitat loss, and over-fishing.

18 GEF-LME Projects in Regional Seas. GEF-LME Projects in Regional Seas already approved (red dots) or in the preparation stage (yellow dots), involve 121 countries of Africa, Asia, the Pacific, Latin America & the Caribbean, and Eastern Europe.

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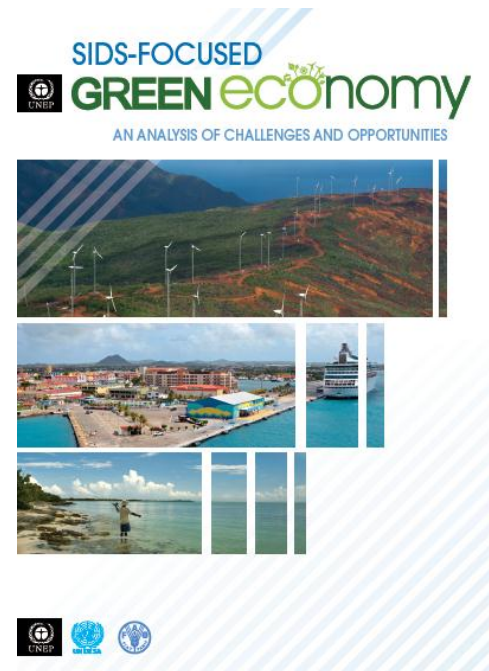
## 3. Strengthen capacity for coastal and marine governance

Review of the Regional Governance mechanisms for the marine environment

- Analyse the legal, institutional and scientific foundations of these regional mechanisms, exploring their respective mandates and ways of intervention
- Analyze cooperation and coordination:
  - Among RSPs / RFBs / LMEs
  - Between RSPs, RFBs and LMEs
- Provide recommendations for making the regional system more coherent, effective and efficient

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5. Strengthen coordination and capacity for state of marine environment reporting, in particular the World Oceans Assessment
  - The first capacity building workshop within the WOA took place in Santiago de Chile for South Pacific region, in September 2011.
  - The second workshop for the Eastern and South Eastern Asian Seas was held in Sanya, Republic of China in February 2012.
  - Third workshop for the Western Indian Ocean (Nairobi Convention) hosted by Government of Mozambique in August 2012.
  - Fourth workshop for the Wider Caribbean region, in November 2012, hosted by the Government of USA.

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5. Strengthen coordination and capacity for state of marine environment reporting, in particular the World Oceans Assessment
  - Fifth workshop for the Pacific region, in February 2013, hosted by the Government of the Australia.
  - Sixth workshop for the Western and Southern Africa region, hosted by the Government of Ivory Coast.
  - Regional Scientific and Technical Capacity Building Workshop on the World Ocean Assessment:
    - East Asian Seas and the Pacific Region, Bangkok, Thailand, September 2012
    - Western Indian Ocean, Maputo, Mozambique, December 2012

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5. Strengthen coordination and capacity for state of marine environment reporting, in particular the World Oceans Assessment
  - Need for improved skills and knowledge on the conduction of integrated assessments-on the marine environment, economic and social aspects).
  - None of the countries had conducted an integrated assessment of the state of marine environment
  - Monitoring reports were scattered among numerous ministries and agencies, some countries had centralized data repositories and contribute to international programmes.
