

The Case for Resilient Food systems in agriculture dominated landscapes



The world's food production system -- agriculture, marine fisheries, inland fisheries – is underlain by an ecological foundation and we are undermining this foundation through land degradation, competition for land, overfishing, pollution, and in many other ways. 


