




- CEP is an inter- governmental regional environmental programme assisted by GEF and EU; in operation since 1998 with a budget of some \$ 30 since.
- World Bank, UNDP and UNEP are major International Partners.
- Presently based in Tehran with a network in the region.
- It is an engine for regional environmental dialogue; diagnostic work and resource mobilization
- Centre piece of Dialogued is the TC signed in 2003 in Tehran and enforceable since 2006

Why should we be concerned with the Caspian?:


- Not so rich but unique biodiversity due to geographical isolation;
 Caspian Seals and Sturgeon
- Rich commercial bioresources worth \$ 5 billions a year
- Rich Hydrocarbon resources-perhaps third after Middle east and Siberia
- Strategic location & Transport Corridor between expanding EU,
 Russia, Middle east, Central Asia and 'Tiger' economies of Asia
- Huge Eco-tourism potentials

Why should we be concerned with the Caspian?


- Flashpoint for conflict due to unsettled legal regime impacting access to resources; ethnical differences& political disputes: here environmental dialogue is a conflict prevention activity
- Highly stressed environment with huge decline in fisheries; hugely reduced Seals; invasive species, serious pollution hotspots; big first timer algae blooms; unsustainable coastal development
- •Window for Climate Change impact with water level fluctuations






Have we sufficiently helped?

- Knowledge based Strategies, Policies and Plans: produced in plenty
 - Diagnostic activities: TDA (2002) and TDA Update (2007)based on original research as well as existing information and data
 - Strategic Action Programme (SAP) (2004) and Updated (2007)
 - National Caspian Action Plans (NCAPs)
 - Public participation Plan
 - Seals Conservation Plan
 - PTS/POPs Regional Action Plan
 - Review of Legislations
 - Regional Environmental Monitoring Programme
 - Pollution Monitoring Programme
 - Control and Mitigation of Invasive Species Traffic Road Map
 - And more

BUT mostly of advisory nature awaiting TC instruments that are expected to have more legal teeth



Implementation & Monitoring Institutional Structures: have built quite a few

PROGRAMME

- CEP Steering Committee; National Focal Points; Coordination Unit Thematic Centres and Thematic Regional Advisory Groups
- TC Interim Secretariat; Conference of Parties; National Focal Points;
 Out-posted TC Liaison Persons
- Inter agency coordination committees
- Selected national monitoring authorities

But fisheries- environment gap has remained and the set up does not work effectively



Have attempted to mobilize resources

PROGRAMME

- Produced NCAPs
- Higher oil revenues have led to increased environmental investment
- Have provided education/training on environmental economics
- Produced fundable projects
- Funded matched grants
- Have funded sustainable livelihood grants
- Have funded micro environmental grants
- Have dialogued with the oil industry

But environmental investment remains insufficient and is likeley to hugely suffer from global economic decline





Integrating aligning &merging processes

- CEP has been a fertile ground for the growth and gestation of the TC
- CEP documents are being hammered into TC documents
- CEP structures are being used by TC
- Excellent UNDP UNEP collaboration has helped the processes.
- Two COPs held with mixed results
- Four protocols being discussed, two more in future

Progress impacted by the political /legal issues and by fisheries challenge



GEF is considering a third project in support of CEP/TC

- Two components, one dealing with eco-based approach to bioresources management and the other dealing with regional environmental governance through support to TC processes
- Total close to \$ 6 million for three years
- Based in Astana in Kazakhstan
- Hope to have fisheries people on board



- All in all satisfactory: good value for money
- Need to go higher levels of government than environment
- Need assist to convince EU and UNEP put more money into the Caspian
- Need more assist from oils
- Need more country ownership
