## Cluster on Environmental Rule of Law

## Recommendations

## We call upon UNEA to:

- 1. <u>Send a strong message about Sstrengthening</u> the links between environment, <u>sustainable developmentSD</u> and <u>the Rule of OLaw</u>, <u>also particularly</u> in the context of the SDGs.
- 2. Support UNEP's efforts to strengthen the judiciaries, prosecutors, and public interest environmental lawyers.
- 3. Encourage states to apply the Bali Guidelines on Rio Principle 10.
- 4. Request states to commit to protect and respect fundamental rights, including the right to a healthy environment, and should instruct UNEP to cooperate with the UN Human Rights Council.
- 5. Strengthen compliance mechanisms for MEAs, particularly the right of the public to bring forward communications.
- 6. Assist states to <u>exchange share</u> experience and good practices on application of environmental rule of law on the national level, and increase dedication of resources to capacity building and enforcement.
- 7. <u>Start work on Strengthen</u> application of the "environmental Rule of Law OL" to multinational corporations business enterprises, e.g., through a binding international legal instruments, to hold corporations accountable for their environmental and human rights violations, taking into account existing frameworks for cooperation.
- -8. Improve environmental governance in general, and especially access to information, public participation and access to justice, as essential to the Rule of Law.
