

Gown Video Guidelines





Whilst not a requirement of your submission, we recommend that all Finalists create a short video about your entry to share with the sector. These videos will be promoted throughout the extensive Green Gown Awards and GUPES networks including a variety of websites such as www.greengownawards.org and http://www.unep.org/training/programmes/gupes.asp. We will promote throughout the communication networks such as Twitter, Facebook and YouTube.

You will find some guidance below. Deadline to get your videos to us is 23 August 2016.

- All videos should be in English or have English subtitles. They may be used at the Awards Ceremony.
- In terms of creating the videos themselves, you may like to get your green champions or students involved as this would be a fantastic project to engage them with sustainability, the Green Gown Awards and your project
- You may like to use free video production software such as animoto (www.animoto.com)
- Watch the podcast of "How to dress as a rabbit to win awards creating short award entry videos" by Walsall College. The podcast will provide you with hints and tips on how to go about creating your short video and how to involve your staff and students. - Format for the videos should ideally be MP4. The videos will be uploaded to the EAUC website and Sustainability Exchange via YouTube. For more information on supported formats, please visit http://support.google.com/youtube/bin/answer.py?hl=en&answer=55744
- Completed videos should be sent via an electronic link such as DropBox (<u>www.dropbox.com</u>) or
 other free file transfer software such as We Transfer (https://www.wetransfer.com/) as they are
 likely to be very large files. Please send the link to greengown@eauc.org.uk. We will confirm safe
 receipt
- Please top and tail the video with:
 - o GUPES Green Gown Awards 2016 logo attached
 - Your institution's logo
 - The category entered
- The video needs to actually be about the 2016 GUPES Green Gown Award submitted project
- It may be nice to include a quote from your Vice Chancellor / or Principal on "what it means to be a finalist"
- If the video includes interviews / people speaking, please try and include their name and title
- Ideal length is approximately 2 5 minutes
- Include information about where viewers can find out more about the project i.e. on your website
