Background

The UNEP Regional Seas Programme aims to address the accelerating degradation of oceans and seas through the cooperation of neighbouring countries sharing marine ecosystems. More than 143 countries participate in the 18 Regional Seas programmes across the world.

Over 40 years, the Programme has demonstrated that regionally coordinated actions are effective in managing the marine and coastal ecosystems that are shared by multiple countries. The regional scale is also a suitable level to apply the ecosystem approach. Building on the long-lasting experience with the Regional Seas programmes, Member States are encouraged to consider capitalizing on the existing Regional Seas mechanisms to implement the ocean-related SDGs, particularly Goal 14.
