Lead is Poisonous

- Lead is harmful especially for children
- Life-long consequences in children including cognitive and behavioral deficits
- Globally lead paint is a major remaining source of childhood exposure
- There is no known level of lead exposure that is considered safe
- Damage from lead exposure is irreversible

Lead Poisoning's Health and Economic Costs

- Exposure to lead has permanent negative impacts to children's developing brains.
- Lifelong consequences are borne by the affected children, their families, and societies at large.
- One key impact: reduction in intelligence quotient (IQ), which can be correlated with decreases in lifetime earning potential.



Individual Children -> Global Costs

- Children's exposure to lead from all sources has staggering economic costs for countries
- \$977 billion in cost for low and middleincome countries from children's lost IQ
 - \$ 135 billion in Africa
 - \$ 142 billion in Latin America
 - \$ 700 billion in Asia


- Lead Paint Alliance is a voluntary global public/ private partnership
