- Strengthen and upgrade the UN Environment through:
 - (a) Universal membership in the governing body
 - (b) Secure, stable, adequate and increased financial resources
 - (c) Enhanced coordination function in the UN system
 - (d) Strong science-policy interface
 - (e) Evidence-based environmental information
 - (f) Capacity-building and technology access
 - (g) Consolidation of headquarters functions in Nairobi and stronger regional presence
 - (f) Active participation of relevant stakeholders

UN Environment and UN Environment Assembly fit for purpose

- Is the strengthened UN Environment meeting up to the expectations of the world leaders at the Rio+20?
- Is UN Environment Assembly adequate in raising high political awareness that the today's environmental problems require?
- How can the UN Environment and the UN Environment Assembly become the driving force in ensuring effective international environmental governance?

Ideas moving forward: Visibility and effectiveness

- Prioritize the implementation of the UN Environment Assembly resolutions
- Identify environmental nexus issues that would bring development gains in other areas
- Enhance the interface between the UN Environment Assembly and multilateral environmental agreements
- Consider organizing the UN Environment Assembly sessions in other geographical locations
- Play a more active role as environmental norm-setter within the UN system through the Environment Management Group
- Align the membership between the UN Environment Assembly and the Committee of Permanent Representatives (118 members)
- Finalize the new stakeholder engagement policy
