TO BE ADOPTED BY THE THIRD UNITED NATIONS ENVIRONMENT ASSEMBLY (UNEA-3)**

We commit to:

Design and implement policies for oceans, seas, and coasts that promote economic opportunities, competitiveness and institutional coordination, to address the effects of pollution and climate change, among others;

Address global marine pollution as a result of human activities in a comprehensive and coordinated manner;

Encourage voluntary commitments by countries to reduce the use of plastic bags and reduce marine pollution;

Increase public-private partnerships for the management of marine litter, plastics and microplastics, as part of an integrated solid waste management;

Encourage a shift towards circular economy models for the production cycles of a wide array of products;

Foster transversal and cross-cutting lines of action on the road to sustainability in cities, which promote multidimensional urban planning committed to the environment and linked to economic and social development;

Consider the responsible use of antimicrobials due to the impact of waste flowing into environment, including through promoting scientific research related to antibiotic resistance;

Foster and encourage synergies among UN bodies and Conventions in order to maximize the results and avoid duplication of efforts;
