## Dear colleagues,

Thank you very much for this advance version of the Background Report of the Executive Director on the theme of the third session of the Assembly, Towards a Pollution-Free Planet and the opportunity to provide our comments. It is a very interesting report which has various linkages to the issues addressed by the Basel, Rotterdam and Stockholm Conventions.

We have two sets of comments. The first set of comments is specifically included in the report with some textual suggestions, primarily in the executive summary and section 2.1.

The second set of comments is presented below.

- There is a general mention of the existence and of work of the UN Special Rapporteur on human rights and chemicals & wastes (now Mr. Baskut Tuncak) (page 21), with a link to the mandate general webpage (in footnote No. 83), however the last paragraph seems incomplete. Also, there are no references on the specific issue under his mandate i.e. children and hazardous substances & wastes, which would fit well in the report, as the particular case of children and pollution are covered by the report. In this regard, the report could mention this issue, and also refer to the Special Rapporteur's latest report to the Human Rights Council in September 2016 which examines the impacts of toxics and pollution on children's rights, and the obligations of States and responsibilities of businesses in preventing exposure by children to such substances.
