List of Reporting Obligations

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Note by the Secretariat

At the Meeting of the MAP Focal Points, held in Athens, Greece, on 12-15 September 2017, Contracting Parties agreed, at the time of discussing the revised reporting format, that clarification should be sought as to the difference between reporting and monitoring mechanisms, and that the Secretariat should compile a comprehensive list of reporting obligations under the Barcelona Convention and its Protocols in preparation for the 20th Meeting of the Contracting Parties (COP 20) (Tirana, Albania, 17-20 December 2017) (UNEP(DEPI)/MED WG.443/21,§22). This document addresses that request.

Listing of reporting obligations

The present document contains a summary in table form of all reporting obligations under the Barcelona Convention, its Protocols and Decisions adopting Regional Action Plans since 2008, when the Format for the Implementation of the Barcelona Convention and its Protocols was introduced.

Table 1 presents a general overview of the reporting obligations upon Contracting Parties, by providing a broad picture of the synergy between the biennial national implementation reports submitted following Article 26 of the Barcelona Convention and relevant articles of its Protocols, and the datasets held by MAP components, mainly MED POL and REMPEC. In Table 1, the existing tiers of reporting under the Barcelona Convention and its Protocols are presented, the complementary of which has been considered when revisiting the revised reporting format. In so doing, the relevant sections of the revised reporting format have been re-structured by providing Contracting Parties with the flexibility to refer to information already provided to MAP components for the concerned reporting period, thus avoiding reporting twice.

Table 2 presents a detailed overview of the reporting obligations upon Contracting Parties per legal instrument, including COP Decisions adopting Regional Action Plans since 2008, putting the focus on the type of the information required. Obligations upon Contracting Parties range from reporting, to notifying to informing on the measures taken to implement the Barcelona Convention, its Protocols and relevant COP Decisions.

Reporting obligations and monitoring mechanisms

12 of the Barcelona Convention as follows:

Under Article 26 of the Barcelona Convention, reporting on the implementation of the Barcelona Convention, its Protocols and recommendations adopted by the meeting of Contracting Parties is a mandatory obligation, which sets the basis for the meetings of the Contracting Parties to keep under review the implementation of the Barcelona Convention and its Protocols (Article 18 of the Barcelona Convention) and to assess the compliance with the Barcelona Convention and its Protocols as well as the measures and recommendations (Article 27 of the Barcelona Convention). The Barcelona Convention and its Protocols include provisions on monitoring, the formulation of which varies per legal instrument. Under Article 12 of the Barcelona Convention, there is a general obligation upon Contracting Parties to endeavor to establish, in close cooperation with the international bodies which they consider competent, complementary or joint programmes, including, as appropriate, programmes at the bilateral or multilateral levels, for pollution monitoring in the Mediterranean Sea Area. The relevant articles of the Protocols specify the general obligation of Article

- (1) under Article 6.1 of the Dumping Protocol, dumping at sea permits for the wastes or other matter listed in Article 4.2 have to be issued only after careful consideration of inter alia those criteria, guidelines and procedures adopted under Article 6.2 of the Protocol. Following that article, specific Guidelines have been adopted, the appropriate consideration of which governs the issuance of permits. This implies that applications for the dumping of wastes or other matter listed in Article 4.2 have to demonstrate that careful consideration has been given to the precautionary procedure for considering disposal at sea outlined in the Guidelines. This includes guidance on monitoring;
- (2) under Article 5 of the Prevention and Emergency Protocol Parties shall develop and apply monitoring activities covering the Mediterranean Sea Area in order to prevent, detect and combat pollution;

- (3) under Article 8 of the LBS Protocol, Parties shall carry out monitoring activities and make access to the public of the findings in order to assess the level of pollution along their coasts, in particular with regard to the sectors of activity and categories of substances listed in Annex I to the LBS Protocol, and to evaluate the effectiveness of actions plans, programmes and measures implemented under the LBS Protocol;
- (4) under Article 3 of the SPA/BD Protocol, Parties shall monitor the components of biological diversity important for its conservation and sustainable use and under Article 20 Parties shall consult, when necessary among themselves and with competent international organizations with a view to identifying, planning and undertaking scientific and technical research and monitoring programmes necessary for the identification and monitoring of protected areas and species and assessing the effectiveness of measures taken to implement management and recovery plans;
- (5) under Article 19 of the Offshore Protocol, the competent authority shall establish, where appropriate, a national monitoring system to monitor regularly the installations and the impact of the activities on the environment, so as to ensure that the conditions attached to the grant of the authorization are being fulfilled, and under
- (6) under Article 16 of the IZCM Protocol on monitoring and observation mechanisms and networks, the Parties shall use and strengthen existing appropriate mechanisms for monitoring and observation, or create new ones if necessary.

This adds to the monitoring requirements under the Regional Action Plans adopted within the framework of the LBS and SPA/BD Protocols and under the Decision on the Integrated Monitoring and Assessment Programme (IMAP) of the Mediterranean Sea and Coast and Related Assessment Criteria.

As noted, under Article 26 of the Barcelona Convention there is a general obligation to report on the implementation of the Barcelona Convention and its Protocols. This includes the provisions dealing with monitoring, as reflected in the Biennial National Reports.
