





There were two discussion sessions that essentially covered the same topics so perhaps one could have been an identification of the problems/obstacles and the other could have been on solutions. It would also have been good to have written reporting back rather than just verbal (thoough time was limited). The 8:00 start time on Friday was not achieved, partly I suppose because quite a few delegates were not staying at the Leogrand, so perhaps a more realistic start time would be best in future meetings.
