Moderated Group Discussion: Making Ambition Loops Work

Session I: Climate Action Now

This session will facilitate group discussion around the pressing question of the UN Secretary General's Climate Action Summit: How can we increase ambitious climate action? Exploring the motivations for immediate climate action, the panel of this session will feature participants from business to discuss questions in an interactive polling format. Audience members will then have the opportunity to respond to these questions and share their experiences and perspectives, fostering an engaging and moderated group discussion between corporate sustainability professionals.

Session II: Climate Policy for Our Only Future

The second moderated session will feature a multi-stakeholder panel of participants from both business and Government to discuss the future of climate policy, including the steps needed to successfully fight climate change and implement systemic change to achieve the Paris Agreement. Structured around answers to questions posed via an interactive poll, this session will encourage the audience to engage in a multi-stakeholder dialogue on climate policy to align on an urgent and collective course of action in tackling the climate crisis.
