





Budget January 2018 - June 2019




Income per funding source(in US\$ million) January 2018 - June 2019




Available Resources (Funds Available) January 2018 - June 2019




Expenditure January 2018 - June 2019






Budget, Income, Available Resources and Expenditure (Multi-Year Funds) January 2018 - June 2019



Funds by Sub-Programme January 2018 - June 2019




2018-2019 Budget

BALANCING THE FUNDING

Earmarked funds = replicate core work:

-in more countries -with more partners



Core funds = our essential capacity:

-science-policy -innovation & advocacy for solutions -convening stakeholders -capacity building -leadership, direction & oversight

Imbalance = risks:

-reduced ability to direct resources towards the priorities mandated by all the Member States/PoW.

-increased focus on donor preferences – not necessarily institutional priorities or internationally agreed goals



90 Member States pledged to contribute to UNEP's Environment Fund in 2018 (figures as at 30/09 2019)

Funding UNEP is the responsibility of all 193 Member States but less than 50% pay.

As at end September 2019:

2018: 90 Member States have pledged, 74 paid

2019: 70 Member States pledged and 49 paid.
