

Includes predefined outline and templates for qualitative and quantitative data

NIP Module

Interconnects with the Electronic Reporting Module

NIP predefined format could be downloaded as Word doc, completed and uploaded automatically online

Electronic Reporting Module

Represented by the current Electronic Reporting System

Interconnects with the NIP Module

E-Reporting Module

Allows to retrieve/transfer data/information from/to NIP Module

Predefines data/information reported previously

POPs Inventory Module (TBC)

Summarizes POPs inventory guidance documents for Annex A chemicals

Summarizes POPs inventory guidance documents for Annex B chemicals

Makes link to Dioxin Toolkit
