## BRIEFING FOR CPR ON RESOLUTION 2/3

5 key components of the resolution

**2/3/1:** Requests the provision of "technical assistance and capacity-building through access to environmental education, training and capacity-building opportunities, including increased capacity development to help Member States, <u>upon request</u>"

2/3/2: Requests the promotion of cooperation and interaction between UNEP and higher education in mainstreaming environment and education through education and training;

2/3/3: Requests enhanced cooperation with all relevant UN bodies on this agenda;

2/3/4: Invites member states – in a position to do so – to support the work of UNEP to enhance environmental education;

**2/3/5**: Requests a report on progress on the implementation at the UN Environment Assembly;

It also welcomes the efforts of the United Nations Environment Programme "to develop innovative educational tools and methodologies".
