

Post-2020 global biodiversity framework

Fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties (COP15), 2020 in China, will adopt a new post-2020 global biodiversity framework accompanied by an inspirational and motivating 2030 mission as a stepping stone towards the 2050 Vision "Living in harmony with nature". (CBD, COP14, 14/34)

Post-2020 Global Biodiversity Framework

- In 2020 the Convention on Biological Diversity will adopt a post-2020 global biodiversity framework as a stepping stone towards the 2050 Vision of "Living in harmony with nature".
- In its decision 14/34 the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity adopted a comprehensive and participatory process for the preparation of the post-2020 global biodiversity framework.
- The process adopted by Parties to develop the post-2020 global biodiversity framework contains a set of principles to guide its implementation, an organization of work and sets out a comprehensive consultation process, including provisions for global, regional and thematic consultation meetings.
- The process requires that an initial discussion document summarizing and analyzing the initial views of Parties and observers be made available in January 2019

Open-ended Intersessional Working Group

 The negotiations to develop the post-2020 global biodiversity framework, prior to the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the **Parties to the Convention on Biological** Diversity, will be undertaken by a dedicated open-ended intersessional working group under the leadership of its two co-chairs, Mr. Francis Ogwal (Uganda) and Mr. Basile van Havre (Canada) and overseen by the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties.

The First Meeting of the Open Ended Working Group on the post 2020 Global Biodiversity Framework

Nairobi, 27-30 August, 2019 Resulted in the further discussion of the Elements Paper, Zero Draft on scope and structure and schedule of consultations with stakeholders in the run-up to China 2020.


UNEP also provided 4 technical submissions to the Post 2020 Global Biodiversity Framework




Road map to China



Process – Sequence of events




CBD Post 2020 Process


