Changes to the MTS and PoW

1. **Strategic objectives** embedded **within thematic subprogrammes** for **more coherence and greater focus**
2. Clearer **interlinkages** and **integration** between subprogrammes
3. Sharper **language** and more “user-friendly” **editing**
4. Stronger **linkage with Agenda 2030**: MTS firmly placed in the context of the **Decade of Action**
5. **PoW** “annexed” to the MTS to **streamline** the document and align with UN Management Reform
