### **Recommendations and Programme Budget for 1992-1993**

#### **Effects of inflation on the proposed 1992-1993 Programme Budget**

**A Note by the Secretariat**

1. The Bureau of the Contracting Parties meeting in Brussels on 9-10 April 1991 was informed of the Secretariat's intention to submit an increased budget proposal for the 1992-93 biennium in order to reflect the cost increases of the current level of activities and to allow for a further expansion in some components of the Action Plan.
2. The Bureau requested the Secretariat to prepare a brief paper for the Joint Meeting of the two Technical Committees (Athens, 6-10 May 1991) to identify separately the effects of inflation and the additional activities proposed (UNEP/BUR/39/5, paragraph 31).
3. The analysis contained in the present document compares the 1992-93 budget components with the corresponding 1990-91 components approved by the Sixth Meeting of Contracting Parties. It is divided in five parts: Meetings; Training courses; Fellowships; Other activities; Personnel and operational costs. Inflation and exchange rate fluctuations affect each type of activity and each Centre to a different degree.
4. The cost of meetings and training courses has increased because of higher air fares, per diem rates, and cost of interpretation. The cost of an average meeting, in Athens, for example, with one participant from each Contracting Party, for a 5-day duration, with interpretation from and into English and French, has risen from \$34,498 in 1989 to \$43,616 in 1991, an increase of 26.4 percent. It will be noted that the number of meetings and training courses proposed has actually decreased compared with the previous biennium.
5. The cost of salaries is determined by the United Nations for UN personnel. For non-UN Centres, salaries were approved by the Contracting Parties, but the Bureau agreed to adjust them on an emergency basis in the case of PAP/RAC. It will be noted that the number of posts has remained unchanged while costs have increased by 13.15 per cent.
6. The cost of individual fellowships is similarly affected by travel costs and UN stipend rates. All of the above factors are beyond the control of the Secretariat and, indeed, of the Parties themselves.
7. In the case of assistance, the higher cost of most equipment and supplies has been partially offset by exchange rate fluctuations in the countries where such equipment is purchased.
8. Other components reflect an increase in activities. This refers, in particular, to the proposal to devote more funds to the coastal areas management projects and to the holding of a Conference of Plenipotentiaries on the Offshore Protocol. Comparisons are shown in the table below:

9. The meeting will appreciate that most of the increases are incompressible if the same level of activities is to be maintained. To keep the level of expenditures for personnel in 1992 at the level of 1989 would require the reduction of several posts, the exact number depending on the level of the posts affected.

10. The Joint Meeting should carefully consider the proposed programme on the basis of the relative importance and urgency of the programme components. It should make a unanimous recommendation to be transmitted to the Seventh Ordinary Meeting of Contracting Parties in Cairo (October 1991).

11. The Contracting Parties will also have before them the recommendations of a group of financial experts, as decided by the Bureau. The financial experts will be requested to design a formula for reflecting correctly the effects of inflation and exchange rate fluctuations on the MAP budget. On the basis of the recommendations of the Joint Meeting, and the findings of the financial experts, the Seventh Ordinary Meeting in Cairo will adopt the Programme Budget of 1992-93 with the corresponding level of contributions.
