#### <u>Climate</u>

The Eastern European Plain (95% of the area), together with Ukrainian Carpathians and Crimean Mountains (5% of the area) have mainly a temperate continental climate. The Southern Crimea climate has subtropical features.

In 2014 the absolute minimum of air temperature was minus 31<sup>0</sup> in February in the Luhansk oblast. In 2014 the absolute maximum of air temperature was plus 40<sup>0</sup> in August in the Dnipropetrovsk, Kherson, Autonomous Republik of Crimea oblasts.

# **Political System**

Ukraine is a sovereign, independent, democratic, social and legal state.

Ukraine is a Republic. Ukraine's people represent the sovereignty and the unified source of power in the country. People execute power directly as well as through state authorities and local self-administration offices.

State power in Ukraine is exercised on the basis of its legislative, executive and judicial branches.

Ukraine's Constitution has supreme judicial power.

The President of Ukraine is the Head of the State and speaks on behalf of its name<sup>1</sup>. The President elected by citizens of Ukraine on the basis of the common, equal and direct voting right by ballot for the period of five years and no more than for two terms successively.

The legislative branch consists of a one-chamber parliament – the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine. Executive power is carried out by the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine.

Political parties and public organisations take active part in the creation of the democratic state. They are the source of innovation and social and political technologies suggested to the society. They also act as guarantors of the democratic development of Ukraine.

In Ukraine there are 233<sup>2</sup> political parties and 61,090<sup>3</sup> public organisations with international and all-Ukrainian status.













# Increase, decrease (–) in basic animal products output, 2014

#### Volume indices for passengers transported (percent of the previous year)





In 2014, Ukrainian Airline to/from Ukraine performed 63.5 thsd. international and 18.3 thsd. domestic air fligts.

25 Ukrainian airlines worked at the market of **passenger air transportation**<sup>1</sup>, among them the largest were «Ukraine International Airlines" (volume contraction by 14.6% as compared to 2013), "Wizz Air Ukraine" (decrease by 19.4%), "Yuteir Ukraine" (decrease by 24.1%), "Rosa Witriv" (decrease by 11.9%), "Airlines of Kharkiv" (increase by 33.9%) and "Dniproavia" (increase by 20.7%).

**Scheduled international passenger air flights** from/to Ukraine were operated by 8 Ukrainian airlines to 35 countries and by 42 foreign air carries from 28 countries of the world, including 4 new ones (from OAE "Emirates Airline", from Greece "Ellinair", from Iran "Taban Air" and "Vista Georgia" from Georgia).

Among the services rendered by Ukraine to other countries of the world in 2014, the greatest share is made up by **transport services** – 53.3% (6.0 bln. USD), of which 36.7% pipeline, 17.4% rail, 13.8% sea and 17.8% air transport. In 2014, the trading and fish ports, and the industrial wharfs (sea and river) of Ukraine have processed 147.5 mln.t of cargo. Within cargo traffic that comes through the Ukrainian ports (wharfs), exports cargo (70.6%) and transit cargo (13.9%) prevail. Sea and river ports (wharfs) render services to about 15.0 thsd. vessels, 10.8 thsd. of them are of foreign origin and vessels belonging to foreign carriers.




