On 3 November 2016, one day before the Paris Agreement enters into force, UN Environment (UNEP) and partners will launch new scientific assessments that reveal the gap between international commitments made by governments and the actual emissions reductions required to stay below global temperature rise.

The Emissions Gap Report tracks the policy commitments made by countries to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and analyses how these policies will translate into emissions reductions through 2030, clearly outlining the emissions gap and what it would take to bridge it; with direct links to SDGs, sustainable energy, gender, actions b non-state actors and financing climate change.

The 1 Gigaton Report analyses GHG reductions resulting from renewable energy and energy efficiency — estimated to be over 1 GtCO2e by 2020, and how these reduction contribute to bridging the emissions gap.
